Homeless & In Need of Shelter

During the daytime hours (8:30 - 4:30):

Sussex County Division of Social Services - If individual/family has little or no income, they can apply for general assistance (GA) for singles or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) if they have children M-F 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Housing assistance may also be provided. 83 Spring Street, Newton (the old Shelby's building a.k.a. DASI: Domestic Abuse & Sexual Assault Intervention Services- provides emergency shelter for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault who are not safe in their own homes. For access and assessment, call

Birth Haven: short-term shelter & education for homeless & pregnant women (973) 579-7979 www.birthhaven.org

During the evening hours (after 4:30 p.m.):

If an individual or family is homeless and in an unsafe situation outside of normal business hours, they need to go to a local police station or the Sheriff's Department. A call will be placed from there to the homeless hotline for assistance.

NORWESCAP Homelessness Prevention & Rapid Rehousing Program: temporary financial assistance and stabilization services for individuals/families at or below 30% of the area's median income who are homeless or at risk due to a rental eviction (877) 661-4357 or (908) 454-7000 ext. 118

In Need of Heating Assistance

NORWESCAP - Home Energy Assistance Program (HEA) - 1-888-454-4778 (toll-free number)/local numbers for Franklin office - (973) 383-6020 & (973) 209-7549. Clients have to apply for this benefit and the program is based on income guidelines. Try this referral first. Agency provides heating system repairs/replacements as well.

NJ Shares- utility assistance for ineligible households for LIHEAP; apply at Project Self-Sufficiency (973) 940-3500

Sussex County Division of Social Services – (973) 383-3600; this is the second option for heating.

People Help - (973) 729-1745 Clients have to be referred by an agency. You can call on behalf of a client in need. People Help will assist clients financially with an emergency need once a year.

In Need of Money (for transportation, car repairs, food, etc.)

- Sussex County Division of Social Services clients can apply for the NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (formerly food stamps), assistance with back rent, back utility and/or security deposit for housing. Social Services also has a food pantry on site. (973) 383-3600
- People Help Clients have to be referred by an agency in order to access these funds. You can call on behalf of a client in need. People Help will assist clients financially with limited funds for an emergency need once in a 12-mos. period. The funds are mailed directly to the vendor or service. Such needs include utility bill, heating, medical equipment, food, transportation, car repair, propane, etc. (973) 729-1745 (you have to leave your name, contact information & who referred you and a volunteer from this agency will call you back).
