Student Progress

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
• Formal and informal student assessment • Preschool progress reports • Teacher/parent conferences • Frequent ongoing communication between school and home

Preschool Intervention and Referral Team (PIRT)

PIRT is a team of school staff that provides support for students who exhibit challenging behaviors, have difficulty with communication, or struggle with classroom routines and/or academics.

Meetings are scheduled to develop a plan which includes strategies to support the student's needs.
The student is monitored closely with ongoing updates (for further strategies when needed.





Early Childhood Advisory Council

Early childhood advisory council or "ECAC" means an advisory group of community stakeholders interested in the education and welfare of children in preschool through grade three that is convened by the school district. (N.J.A.C.6A:13A-1.2)

Its purpose is to review preschool program implementation of high-quality programs, serve as advisory support for the local school district's preschool program, and support transition as children move from preschool through grade three.



Registration Process

• New student registration begins March 11th • Preschool program is free to Hopatcong residents • Child must turn 3 prior to October 1, 2024 • Child must not be eligible for Kindergarten • Click on the Registration tab on the district website www.hopatcongschools.org • Required paperwork must be submitted along with online registration in order to be officially enrolled


