Program Overview




We are a federally funded early childhood education program serving the most vulnerable children and families.

The teachers have ongoing professional development days and opportunities scheduled throughout the year.





CHILD DEVELOPMENT

FAMILY ADVOCACY








- Individual Family

FAMILY STYLE MEALS






For Breakfast, Lunch, and Snack we use family style dining






Automatic Eligibility
