Community

Hopatcong Borough is located at the southeastern tip of beautiful Sussex County in northwestern New Jersey, approximately 50 minutes from New York City. There are 14,000 residents. Hopatcong High School is a public four-year comprehensive school that strives to provide a quality education to all of its students. Through the Hopatcong Borough curriculum this goal is achieved by empowering and challenging students and providing an environment conducive to learning.

Graduation Requirements

Hopatcong High School is accredited by the New Jersey State Department of Education. To graduate and receive a high school diploma from Hopatcong High School, every student must demonstrate proficiency in both the math and ELA components of the New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment (NJGPA), abide by district/state attendance policies and successfully complete a total of 120 credits including the following:

GPA/Class Rank

Grade point averages are computed on a 4.0 basis. One additional quality point is awarded for grades in Honors and AP courses. All courses are included in class GPA calculations, with the exception of any courses taken as pass/fail, audit or online. Valedictorian and Salutatorian will be named during the fourth marking period for graduation purposes.

Grading System

Students earn grades based on a quarterly marking period system. Each marking period grade is worth 20% of the final course grade and the midterm and final exams are worth 10% of the final grade each. Student performance is evaluated on a numerical grading system ranging from 100 - 0. The numeric range of the alpha grade (F) will be worth a minimum of 50 to a maximum of 64 for 8th-12th graders for the first and second marking period only. For the third and fourth marking periods, the students will receive the actual numeric grade they earn.
